This is South-East Asia's first process Automated Dairy.The technology uses PLC (Programmable Logic Controller) and provided with SCADA (Supervisory Control and Data





Acquisition) system. The automation system has been provided with hot standby PLC which takes over the control if the primary fails. As the process is fully automated the CIP (Cleaning In Place) process is very effective, resulting in consistency of finished product quality. This Dairy is certified with ISO – 22000-2005.
