Guest Lecture on Business Intelligence for Decision Making

On 29.07.2024, we had the privilege of hosting a guest lecture on the topic "Business Intelligence for Decision Making," delivered by Dr. Vijayan Sugumaran, a distinguished Professor of Management Information Systems from Oakland University, USA. The lecture was attended by 70 scholars, students, and faculty members, marking a successful event filled with insightful discussions and learning.



The program commenced with a warm welcome address by Dr. Hassan Shareef, who set the tone for the event by highlighting the importance of business intelligence in today's data-driven world.
